Natural disasters are you covered?



With extreme weather events on the rise, it's important to know if your home and property is protected in the event of a natural disaster. - Are there additional coverage options available to help protect you from potential loss in the event of a natural disaster?
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What does the additional coverage include? For example, additional coverage for an earthquake may include damages resulting from the earthquake itself, like the collapse of the house. However, you may need another additional coverage for fire damage that occurs as a result of the earthquake.

Whether or not you choose to purchase additional coverage, regularly inspecting and maintaining your home can enhance your safety and help reduce damage in the event of a natural disaster.
